## **BYOD Policy**

## I. Background:

In the school years 2011-14, the English Department implemented PLPR/W@eLearning (P.1-3) with the grant (\$2,100,000) from Pilot Scheme on e-Learning in Schools, a program launched by the Education Bureau (EDB). With interactive e-Learning activities, students' learning efficiency has enhanced; thus our school extended the implementation of e-Learning with another grant from EDB (\$1,200,000) to upgrade our I.T. facilities – Smart Boards and Touch Screens had been installed in classrooms and special rooms and Wi-Fi coverage had expanded across the campus.

Since September 2014, our school has implemented the Pilot Scheme on e-Textbooks – students of P.2-6 are required to "Bring Your (their) Own Device" (BYOD) for e-Learning. In recent years, the policy has been fine-tuned to cater for the different needs of junior (P.1-3) and senior (P.4-6) students. Arrangements are as follows:

### P.1-3: BYODO (Bring Your Own Device Occasionally)

Students of P.1-3 use printed textbooks and only bring their own tablet computers (iPad) to school on specific days for e-learning activities.

#### P.4-6: BYDOED (Bring Your Own Device Every Day)

Students of P.4-6 are required to bring their own tablet computers (iPads) to school every day. The MDM (Mobile Device Management) system will be installed to assist in downloading specific applications for e-Learning.

## II. Objectives:

- 1. Enhance the interactive experience of learning and teaching; expand the depth of student learning.
- 2. Further improve students' learning motivation and learning effectiveness.
- 3. Comprehensively develop students' ability to use e-learning and enhance students' information technology literacy.
- 4. Cultivate students' independent learning, creativity, collaboration and problem-solving abilities through the use of electronic learning materials.

#### III. Subjects:

Chinese, English, Mathematics, General Studies, Innovative Technology, Putonghua, Music and Visual Arts

#### VI. Arrangements:

- 1. Students of P.4-6 have to bring the tablet computer (iPad) to school every day and all e-Textbooks must be downloaded at the beginning of the school year. The iPad has to be submitted to our school for MDM installation.
- 2. In P.4-6, only e-Textbooks are allowed in class.
- 3. Printed copies are used for most other reading materials and school-based booklets.
- 4. Assignments, assessments and examinations are all done with pen and paper.

- V. Tablet computer models and accessories:
- 1. Model: iPad, iPad Air, iPad Pro or the latest model Wi-Fi version (iPad mini is not recommended)
- 2. Capacity: 256 GB or above
- 3. Operating system: iOS 18 or above
- 4. The iPad should be equipped with a screen protector, protective case and earphones
- VI. Bring your own iPad or borrow an iPad (Quality Education Fund e-Learning Funding Programme)
- 1. Under the BYOD Policy, parents have to provide students with an iPad for e-Learning.
- 2. Families with financial difficulties can apply for the iPad loan service supported by Quality Education Fund e-Learning Funding Programme. Eligible students are those who are receiving Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA) from the Social Welfare Department, or full/half grant of the School Textbook Assistance Scheme (STAS) from the Student Finance Office. Details of the programme is released in September.
